MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE FEDERAL CROP INSURANCE CORPORATION

A meeting of the Board of Directors (Board) of the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC) was held on August 9, 2012 in Washington, DC. The public was invited to attend the open session portion of the meeting. Meeting August 9, 2012,

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am, August 9, 2012, in Room 108A, Jamie Whitten Building, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, DC, in open session.

Call to Order Open Session

The Board immediately went into executive session to discuss confidential matters with Risk Management Agency (RMA) staff and submitters of private products under the Federal Crop Insurance Act (Act).

Executive Session

The open session of the Board reconvened on August 9, 2012, at 11:30 am.

Reconvene Open Session

David Grahn read the recitation to all members of the Board to advise the Board of its responsibilities in representing the interests of the FCIC and USDA and advised each member to act accordingly.

Manager's Report

Chairman Glauber asked Bill Murphy for the Manager's Report (the Manager's Report is available on line at www.rma.usda.gov). Mr. Murphy noted that RMA is redesigning the Price Discovery application that provides prices and volatility factors for the revenue based insurance offers. The public reporting features of the new application will include a modern layout, user tools, the ability for handling data, and eventually be accessible by mobile phone application. The initial version of the website will be launched in late August 2012 in a "Public Test" format. Mr. Murphy also stated that RMA has received many drought related questions from producers and approved insurance providers (AIPs). To assist in answering these questions, RMA has developed a document "2012 Drought Questions and Answers." This document is available on the RMA Website.

Hearing no objection, Dr. Glauber agreed to dispense with a reading of the Manager's Report. (Exhibit 4085)
