Apple, Blueberry, and Peach Growers Need to Make Insurance Decisions Soon

VALDOSTA, Ga., Nov. 2, 2017 - USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds South Carolina apple, blueberry, and peach growers that the final date to apply for crop insurance coverage is November 20. Current policyholders who wish to make changes to their existing coverage also have until the November 20 sales closing date to do so.

Federal crop insurance is critical to the farm safety net. It helps producers and owners manage revenue risks and strengthens the rural economy. Coverage is available for apples in Greenville, Oconee, and Spartanburg counties. Crop insurance coverage is also available for blueberries in Horry County. Crop insurance coverage is available for peaches in Aiken, Allendale, Anderson, Calhoun, Cherokee, Chesterfield, Edgefield, Greenville, Lexington, Marlboro, Orangeburg, Saluda, Spartanburg, and York counties.

Growers are encouraged to visit their crop insurance agent soon to learn specific details for the 2018 crop year. Growers can use the RMA [Cost Estimator](#) to get a premium amount estimate of their insurance needs online.
