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Crop Insurance Deadline Nears in South Carolina

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Barley, Canola, Oats, Rye, and Wheat Growers Need to Make Insurance Decisions Soon

VALDOSTA, Ga., Sept. 15, 2016 - USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds South Carolina barley, canola, oats, rye, and wheat growers the final date to apply for crop insurance coverage for the 2017 crop year is September 30. Current policyholders who wish to make changes to their existing coverage also have until the September 30 sales closing date to do so.

Crop insurance provides protection against a loss in production due to natural perils, such as drought or excessive moisture. Coverage is available for barley in Anderson, Laurens, Newberry, Oconee, Orangeburg, and York counties. Coverage is available for canola in Dillon County. Coverage is available for rye in Aiken, Chesterfield, and Edgefield counties. Coverage is also available for oats and wheat in select counties.
